

Community Council Priorities

Nebraska will cultivate an economic, political, and regulatory environment conducive to IT development by:

- Promote the development of an infrastructure (including sufficient bandwidth) that is secure, affordable, reliable, and responsive to the specific needs of various sectors. Efforts should be made to ensure that systems across the state are compatible.
- Support the development of the intellectual infrastructure necessary for Information Age development. Intellectual infrastructure includes the development of a workforce knowledgeable of and fluent in the use and applications of information technology and the availability of IT support services.
- Develop leadership capacity in Nebraska's communities to address information technology development.
- Encourage the use of information technology to enhance community and economic development.
- Foster awareness and collaborative and innovative uses of information technology by local governments to reduce costs, improve efficiency, and provide better customer service.
