<u>Project overview</u> – Steve Hannah detailed the project as set forth under the grant the NGP received from the US Dept of Labor. This project is titled "Building an eBusiness Ready Workforce in the Northern Great Plains". The project is for developing and enhancing internet use in rural businesses and for education and training employees in the internet applications. Exploring and building awareness of opportunities the internet brings to businesses will be an essential component. Equally important to the success of the project is the development of a long-range plan to support ongoing training and technical support needs of the workforce in our communities. The NGP group will provide 40 hours of training in Cambridge based on what our local committee determines is needed. Besides the NGP training, an educational partner(s) will be needed for additional classes and training.

2. NGP educational curriculum (info below was found online)

Historically the NGP staff involved themselves in a broad range of information technology related activities, including research of current trends in telecommunications and information technologies and how these technology trends will impact on the Region's businesses and industries. The intended outcome of this effort is to bring practical information and solutions to the Region's communities, businesses and organizations through workshops and hands-on training.

For 2001 the NGP staff has developed seven workshops with a focus on awareness or technology transfer to assist the Region's businesses and industries to move forward with their efforts in Internet communications and marketing, or what is often called eBusiness. The workshop series is geared towards several levels of eBusiness experience starting with businesses with almost no experience to those with some experience but are not getting the results they expected. Titles and a brief description of the workshops are listed below.

Development Strategies for a Business Website

This session examines current business website trends, implementation, and opportunities with a focus on website development strategies for small to medium businesses and organizations. This workshop is especially valuable to businesses and organizations that don't have a website but want to get started on one and add an Internet presence to their marketing efforts.

<u>Information System Security - What Every System Administrator Should Know About Data Vulnerability</u> This intensive one-day seminar introduces participants to the security issues businesses will encounter when deploying an eBusiness strategy. The discussions follow two tracks, Local and Wide Area Network security and Internet security. Lecture is interspersed with actual demonstrations of the technologies discussed in the seminar.

eBusiness: Fundamentals

This comprehensive Internet business awareness workshop looks at the steps in the process of implementing an eBusiness strategy, defining the eBusiness enterprise, and meeting the challenges of changing business relationships. The workshop takes a look at what factors are affecting the adoption of an eBusiness strategy as well as possible business benefits of an eBusiness initiative.

Trends in Telecommunications and Information Technologies that will Impact Communities and Small Business

This workshop examines the trends in telecommunications and information technologies, and the potential impact these coming changes will have on how communities and businesses provide services to their citizens and customers.

Website Design Fundamentals - Introduction to Web Page Design Using NetObjects Fusion

This one-day hands-on workshop focuses on issues related to building a website, including what makes good website design and how to avoid the worst mistakes related to poorly designed websites. This website design class uses the award-winning NetObjects Fusion editor. The course covers the key website development features of NetObjects Fusion starting with creating a site, using the site management tools, adding advanced content, and publishing a site to the World Wide Web

Electronic Commerce Workshop - Building an Online Store through an Application Service Provider

This day-long workshop looks at the issues related to moving an informational website into an eCommerce website capable of taking orders online. This workshop focuses on four entry level online store building tools and realistic options for businesses that want to get an online store up and running fast with a turn-key solution provided by an Application Service Provider(ASP). The workshop centers on the store front website from the perspective of both the shopper and the store manager, looking at issues related to order security, ease of ordering, how orders are retrieved, and building and managing your own online store. Examples of ASP's that will be discussed include -Yahoo Store, Jumbo Mall, Impulse Software, PayFlow Link, iCat – iStore PNC, goBIZgo

Website Promotion to the Search Engines - How to Make it Easier for Customers to Find Your Website through a Search on the Internet The focus of this workshop is to give participants an understanding of how their website would be found through a search on a search engine. Participants will learn to recognize the relationship between website domain names and search engines. They will gain an understanding of the process of registering their website with a search engine and how to check results. The workshop also covers issues related to maintaining search engine listings and managing domain names. Participants will learn how to check on the status of your domain name registration record and make modifications to the record with Internic.

- 3. <u>Educational partners to consider</u> Steve Hannah concurred that more than one educational partner could be selected. Thinking outside-the-box on non-traditional resources is encouraged. Steve also confirmed that participation from anyone in the region not just Cambridge is encouraged. The participants will most likely contribute financially for the classes, but the grant should make a real difference in affordability. Steve encouraged stretching and leveraging the grant as far as possible.

REAP's Women's Business Center will be sponsoring 4-night eCommerce training courses for small businesses regionally across Nebraska (\$49, includes REAP membership). Also, Basic Business Plan Training courses will be conducted across the State (\$30 course fee and REAP membership + \$35 for materials which may be covered by income eligible scholarships). REAP offers individualized business planning assistance and ongoing technical assistance services to clients. REAP also makes micro-loans to small businesses.

ROSP is currently working with rural communities in partnership with REAP and the policy program within the Center for Rural Affairs in a holistic package project called HOPE. We have worked with the various agencies in doing comprehensive planning which includes technology needs and goals.

Since September 1998, 40 projects have received a total of \$834,200 from the Nebraska Information Technology Commission's Community Technology Fund. The projects funded demonstrate how information technology is being used to improve efficiency and enhance economic development.
