The Office of the CIO is prepared to announce the 2013-14 Network Nebraska-Education fees and also update you on a number of exciting developments relative to the statewide education network.

I am pleased to report that seven new K-12 entities and one new independent college will be joining Network Nebraska during summer 2013. The public K-12 entities will eligible this fall to begin earning distance education incentives from the Education Innovation Fund. A Participant Report Summary appears at the end of this memo as we pass the sixth anniversary of the statewide network consortium known as Network Nebraska-Education.

The Network Nebraska Advisory Group (NNAG) is now in its fourth year of existence—comprised of 8 individuals from K-12 and 8 from higher education. These members normally meet about six times per year and indirectly represent the interests of all 261 education entities presently on the K-20 network. Their job is to provide strategic vision and operational recommendations to the Office of the Chief Information Officer as we manage and grow the network. We have over 50 WAN circuit changes scheduled for implementation during summer 2013. The UNCSN project team is working with providers and education staff to make sure the conversion goes smoothly.

Several changes happened with statewide Internet access, effective 7/1/2013. Network Nebraska-Education bandwidth with Unite Private Networks increased by 118%. The unit price for 2013-14 decreased by 2% (to \$2.50/Mbps/month). For the second year in a row, the Office of the CIO has assumed the E-rate filing on the eligible portion of the statewide Internet purchase and will be billing the eligible entities the post-E-rate amounts.

The Network Nebraska-Education backbone increased in bandwidth from 1.7Gbps to 2.0Gbps. The annual cost will decrease by 15% for 2013-14 due to the reduction in aggregation circuit costs in Omaha which have become the financial responsibility of a WAN provider. Consequently, entities will see a decrease (7% or 12%) in their monthly Interregional Transport fees.

The Office of the CIO is excited to announce the addition of two new services, enterprise Intrusion Prevention Services (IPS) using Fortinet devices, and Commercial Peering Service (CPS) through Internet2. IPS will help increase network security and CPS will provide a faster Internet peering pathway to such entities as Microsoft, Apple, Google, and other companies to augment Network Nebraska's normal commodity Internet option.

The Participation Fee budget for 2013-14 includes a line item called "Network Upgrade Project" which will be used to help pay for a share of a University of Nebraska dark fiber project, which will provide increased capacity in the Lincoln-to-Grand Island transport segment before the 2014-15 year. There will also be some one-time upfront equipment costs to establish the CPS pathway to Internet2 in Kansas City. Consequently, there will be a modest (6%) increase in Participation Fees for 2013-14.

The NNAG recommended that the OCIO videoconferencing bridge services be maintained at 12 simultaneous multi-point connections for administrative videoconferencing by any Network Nebraska member. More details about how to use this service are available from your ESU distance education coordinator or college technology officer.

The Network Nebraska Advisory Group, the OCIO financial solutions team, and the Collaborative Aggregation Partnership (CAP) have been reviewing the network revenue and expenses for 2013-14 and are prepared to announce the 2013-14 rates, which will take effect with the August 2013 billing:

In these tough economic times, we all have been able to continue to make advancements in data management technology that improve the security and reliability of the overall network. For this, I commend and thank all of you.

Neb. Rev. Stat. 86-5,100 (excerpt) Network Nebraska; development and maintenance; access; Chief Information Officer; duties; cost; report.

The Chief Information Officer shall provide access to each school district, each educational service unit, each community college, each state college, and the University of Nebraska at the earliest feasible date and no later than July 1, 2012. Access may be provided through educational service units or other aggregation points. Participation in Network Nebraska shall not be required for any educational entity.*

*Note “Access” was defined by the Chief Information Officer as the ability to connect via Ethernet to one of the Network Nebraska—Education core aggregation points.
